Philippines gearing up for presidential elections

February 23, 2016 - MANILA, Philippines — It's not just difficult to predict who will win Philippine presidential elections this year — thanks to some of the candidates' legal woes, it's difficult to predict who will be allowed to run.

Four are within striking distance. Sen. Grace Poe, a political newcomer, leads opinion polls ahead of the May 9 elections, with Vice President Jejomar Binay, close behind. They are followed by former Interior Secretary Mar Roxas and Rodrigo Duterte, mayor of the southern city of Davao.

Poe, 47, has seen her popularity soar since she first ran for office three years ago. She is the adopted daughter of one of the country's most famous movie couples. Her late father mostly played roles as a defender of the downtrodden in a country still plagued by widespread poverty and corruption.

But the Commission on Elections ruled in December that Poe was not a natural-born Filipino as required by

US Presidential elections

The United States presidential election of 2016, scheduled for Tuesday, November 8, 2016, will be the 58th quadrennial U.S. presidential election. Voters will select presidential electors who in turn will elect a new president and vice president through the Electoral College. The term limit established in the Twenty-second Amendment to the United States Constitution prevents the incumbent President, Barack Obama, from being elected to a third term.

The series of presidential primary elections and caucuses is taking place between February 1 and June 2016, staggered among the 50 states, the District of Columbia and U.S. territories. This nominating process is also an indirect election, where voters cast ballots for a slate of delegates to a political party's nominating convention, who then in turn elect their party's presidential nominee. Issues versus personalities in the 2016 Philippine presidential elections

review the candidates' backgrounds and their platforms reveals interesting insights as to who might win the election although most experts agree that it is difficult to predict because of so many variables. For instance, the citizenship of the front runner, Grace Poe, is being studied by the Supreme Court and no one knows when a decision will be handed down. Preferably, the decision as to whether Grace Poe is eligible to run for president should be known before the elections. Meanwhile, she is continuing as an independent to run for president. She has retained her lead in spite of two questions about her eligibility - citizenship and residency requirements.

The first-term senator, 47, is going head to head with Jejomar Binay, 73, vice-president, who is polling second; Mar Roxas, 58, the grandson of a former president and President Benigno Aquino's preferred successor; Rodrigo Duterte, 70, a crime-busting mayor known as "Dirty Harry" and Sen Miriam Defensor Santiago, 70, experienced and served in all branches of government.

Jejomar Binay, a long time mayor of Makati before being elected vice-president has been accused of corruption and having acquired so much wealth while in public office. He is known to be concerned with the plight of the poor, and he has gained popularity for this personality trait.

Mar Roxas, US-educated

ex-banker and grandson of a 1950s president may benefit from Mr Aquino's backing and legacy. Athough he lost to Binay as VP, he was a member of Aguino's cabinet. During the first debate on February 21st, he pointed out the lack experience of Grace Poe. He said: "There is a right time for everything, How will you know if you are being duped? How will you choose between recommendations of your cabinet secretaries?"

In reply, Grace Poe said: "What is important is a leader who can be trusted, Yes, I am new, but our problems are not new and many who have spent a long time in their positions have tried to fix them with old solutions."

Mr Duterte, the seventerm mayor of Davao in Mindanao, the island where the presidential debate was held, focused on the role of federalism in bringing peace to the southern region, which has been blighted by conflict linked to Muslim separatist groups.

Senator Santiago, trailing far behind in the polls, has been sick with cancer but claims she has recovered.

Analysts say that it will be difficult to shift focus from personalities to issues such as poverty, corruption, drug abuse and economy. Under President Aquino, the economy grew by 6.2 percent GDP, but it is not an inclusive growth for it has not included every Filipino.

Whoever is elected president, he or she will face many challenges.

Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor:

I want to thank the Filipino community for attending the January 18 press conference convened by six Montreal City Councillors on the issue of the under representation of visible minorities in municipal life.

We pointed out that only 6 of 208 municipal elected officials in the agglomeration of Montreal are members of visible minorities. That's a shocking number given that nearly 33% of the population of the island is comprised of persons who are visible minorities.

This situation isn't unique to Montreal. While Canada is increasingly a multiracial and multicultural country, most cities including those with visible minority majorities have little or no representatives from visible minority communities.

The press conference was called in support of my motion that went to the January 25 City Council meeting and which urged the municipal political parties to redress the situation and required them to report back to City Council by February 2017, well ahead of the November 2017 election.

Participants at the press conference also raised other issues such as the under representation of visible minorities in the municipal civil service and issues related to obtaining information and services. Those present emanating from the Black, Filipino, Chinese, Vietnamese, Bangladeshi and Pakistani communities urged the Councillors to form a working group that would broaden the debate through 2016.

The motion was adopted at City Council. I consider it a significant action that ultimately can lead to a major change in the complexion of our elected bodies.

But all is not rosy and enormous public effort will still be required.

A second resolution was brought forward at the February 22 City Council by Equipe Coderre, the party of the Mayor. This resolution which was adopted used most of the language of my first motion and urged the parties to work to advance the cause of all under represented groups including women, native people, ethnic communities, including visible minorities, and persons of reduced mobility.

On the face of it, this language would seem to express a noble sentiment. However, making visible minorities, who have faced systemic discrimination and are the most under represented group of all, just another category, seems to me as backing out of the commitment that each party took in voting for my motion.

There are 19 women on Montreal City Council (of 65 elected representatives), all of them white. There are dozens more elected to other Councils in the agglomeration. While we are still unfortunately far from achieving parity between men and women in our elected bodies, in my view the obstacles facing women, particularly those from the majority community, are hardly of the same magnitude as that faced by visible minorities.

However with your support, we will assure that visible minorities are not shunted to the back burner.

The next step will be the hosting of a public meeting in early April where speakers will outline Montreal's governance model and suggest steps that can be taken independently from City Hall to assure greater public interest and participation. It will be my pleasure once the details are finalized to alert the public as we hope to have a large turnout to launch a movement that is aimed at bringing visible minorities into the halls of power.

Poe disqualification case up for resolution

MANILA, Philippines - Sen. Grace Poe's petition questioning the Commission on Elections (Comelec)'s decision to disqualify her from the presidential race

Salle University professor Antonio Contreras, former Government Service Insurance System lawyer Estrella Elamparo and former University of the East College of Law dean Amado Valdez asked the high court to dismiss Poe's petition and uphold the Comelec

is now up for resolution by the Supreme Court (SC).

Parties submitted yesterday their respective memorandum summarizing their arguments heard over the past five Tuesdays.

The petitioners in the disqualification cases against Poe before the Comelec insist that she is not eligible for the presidency because she is not a natural-born citizen and lacks the 10year residency as required by law.

Former senator Francisco Tatad, De La

rulings disqualifying the senator over material misrepresentations in her certificate of candidacy.

They stressed that Poe's camp failed to prove before the SC that she is a natural-born citizen based on law and jurisprudence and likewise failed to debunk Comelec's finding that her residency would only be nine years and six months by Election Day.

Tatad rebutted Poe's arguments invoking international treaties or agreements to claim that foundlings like her are quaranteed natural-born

"(She) insisted that under the 1966 International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR), the 1948 Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) and the 1989 Convention on the Rights of the Child (UN CRC), a foundling is considered a natural-born citizen. (She) relies on these international conventions to convince this commission that she, as a foundling, is a natural-born citizen of the Philippines. But the Comelec First Division already addressed these issues," read Tatad's memorandum filed through lawyer Manuelito Luna.

"The First Division was correct when it held that the ICCPR, the UDHR and the UNCRC do not provide that every child, including a foundling, shall ipso facto be granted by the state-party with a nationality. These conventions are likewise silent and do not particularly commit natural-born citizenship to the child," it added.

Contreras, for his part, debunked the statistics submitted by Solicitor General Florin Hilbay showing the ratio of non-Filipinos to Filipino born children from 1865 to 1975 at 1:661, saying the conclusion drawn was speculative as it does not really address the factual issue on Poe's bloodline.

"The figures of NSO can only refer to the probability of any child to have Filipino parents. It is not correct to include foundlings into the inference since such has not been factored in as a variable in the statistics," he said.

citizenship in the country they are Contreras believes that giving Poe a natural-born citizen status would be tantamount to according her "special treatment."

> On the residency issue, he stressed that the Comelec's decision against Poe was "firmly anchored" on solid jurisprudence.

> "She failed to perform a necessary act (such as acquiring the necessary immigration status) that would have perfect her reacquisition of domicile in the Philippines and would have been substantial proof that she has abandoned her domicile in the US prior to her repatriation in July 2006," he

> He argued that Poe's physical presence in the country, transfer of children's schooling from the US, moving of household and personal belongings to the country, procuring of a taxpayer's identification number to acquiring a condominium unit do not amount to abandonment of her legal domicile in the US.

> Elamparo agreed with this position, saying "the only way Poe could legally actualize those intentions were to apply for re-acquisition of citizenship or at the very least secure a permanent resident's visa. She did not do either of these in May 2005 or shortly thereafter."

> Valdez also rebutted the position espoused by some sympathizing justices of the high court that denying Poe the status of natural-born would be tantamount to injustice to all foundlings.

U.S.-educated Poe, who renounced her Filipino citizenship for about five years to live with her own family in America, also lacked the required 10-year Philippine residency ahead of the vote, the commission said. That prompted Poe to bring her case to the Supreme Court, which could deliver its verdict soon — and have a huge impact on the presidential race.

"This particular election has the most uncertainty," said Ana Maria Tabunda, research director of Pulse Asia, an independent pollster whose latest survey last month showed Poe leading with support from 30 percent of respondents, with Binay garnering 23 percent.

Roxas and Duterte each got 20 percent each in the survey that polled 1,800 people nationwide and had a margin of error of plus or minus 2 benefit. Poe has carried on, holding rallies across the country.

"The story of my life started in a church," Poe told followers when she kicked off her campaign outside a downtown Manila church popular among the underclass. "So I decided to go in front of a church to launch the next chapter of my life."

President Benigno Aquino III's successor will need to grapple with poverty, corruption and Marxist and Muslim insurgencies in the south persistent problems facing the country that three decades ago toppled the dictatorship of Ferdinand Marcos through a "people power" movement.

Aguino's anti-graft campaign led to the detention of his predecessor on an elections fraud charge and three senators, and the economy has grown steadily. However, a tenth of the interior secretary in charge of local governments and the national police.

Legal woes have also hounded Binay and Duterte, a tough-talking mayor who has caught national attention for threatening to take down criminals, drug lords and corrupt bureaucrats within half a year if elected president.

Elections officials have dismissed petitions to disqualify Duterte, 70, but those could still be challenged in court. His party put forward another candidate while they convinced him to run, and some questioned whether he could replace the party's initial nominee.

Binay, 73, faced several months of investigation by a Senate committee over alleged corruption when he was still mayor of Makati city, Manila's version of Wall Street. He has denied the allegations, which have weighed

Though he referred specifically to Trump, Obama also took care to warn about all of the GOP candidates."Not a single one of them" is talking about some of the world's biggest problems, he said.

The words represented Obama's most energetic criticism of the Republicans running to replace him. For months, he has mostly kept a studied distance from the fray and resisted invitations to engage in political analysis."

Hillary Clinton is campaigning today in Chicago trying to shore up support the African-American among community. "This was not only visibly false, but a clear sign that she wasn't just lowering expectations but showing real fear she could lose Nevada.







KEEPING YOUR VIDEO STEADY

A camera is useless if it can not be supported so that image is free of vibration and jerkiness. That is the purpose of camera support products.

Cinematography today has the advantage of technologies that those in the early 20th Century could never imagine, but one thing that has remained unchanged is the need for being able to support the camera and lens so that what is being shot will be held steady and in focus. To satisfy this need, there are a number of camera support solutions available, depending on what kind of shooting the camera will be doing. The following categories illustrate the types of camera solutions that are now available

TRIPOD



A tripod is the most basic of camera supports, but just because it's old school doesn't mean it should be treated with disrespect. Tripods vary in size and composition but their basic purpose is to not just to hold the camera steady during shooting. Tripods also allow for minute control over the positioning of the camera. An example is the VariZoom TK75A Video Camera Tripod, which is suitable for compact video cameras and DSLRs handling cameras of up to 10 lbs. Featuring a quick release plate, the tripod has a 65/75mm fluid head, built-in bubble leveler and the aluminum switchable rubber/spiked feet folds down to 31-inches and extends to 64-inches. The MSRP is \$199. Another example, the Benro AD71FK5, combines a sturdy

lightweight tripod (7.1 lbs.) with a can support up to 11 lbs. and the maximum height extension is 60inches. The legs quickly lock into place and there is also an internal spreader and quick release plate. The MSRP is \$195.



MONOPOD

A monopod can have many of the same attributes as a tripod, except they are usually not able to stand on their own. This is traded in for portability and easier access into areas where a three-legged tripod would not be able to fit. In a real sense, the camera operator functions as part of the tripod, using his/her body to add stability when in use.

An example is the Sachtler Monopod 2 CF, which is composed of carbon fibre and weighs only 1 kg. It has a 100 mm head fitting. Useful for photographers as well as for cinematographers, it has a two-stage extension and reaches a height of 166 cm. It has an MSRP of \$880.

POCKET SUPPORT



These types of tripods are known for their compact size and ease of portability. They can be found in use with cameras that are also compact and portable, such as DSLRs and smartphones or tablets. Durability is an important factor here, since outdoor use will occur as often as indoor. Being able to weather the elements is an important specification. The edelkrone PocketRig2, for example, is a lightweight DLSR portable video rig which has a fully adjustable support arm; it can be used like a monopod by using the belt groove on the shoulder piece or can provide stabilization through a rifle-like precision matched K5 video head. It approach. It has industry standard 15mm rods for attaching follow focus, matte boxes and standard handles, and extends up to 18cm. Use of the 1/4-inch connection hole on the bottom lets it attach to a tripod for use as a base plate solution. The MSRP is \$290.

SHOULDER MOUNTED RING

A shoulder-mounted rig adds stability and focus control for the camera operator, while allowing movement during shooting. It also enables access into areas where a traditional tripod would be unable to go, as well as rapid movement on the part of the camera operator. In the past, heavier cameras helped to create a center of gravity for those using the rig, so as to make movements during shooting more stable. With today's lighter cameras, a bit more concentration will be of service. An example is the **SYMPLA** Manfroto Shoulder Mounted Rig. It supports camera equipment on the shoulder of the camera operator and has swivel-joint handles and a quick release plate. It's ideal for use with DSLRs and interchangeable lens camcorders. The Variable Plate allows for quickly adjusting the position of the camera in combination with all other accessories being used. It has an MSRP starting at \$390.

Handheld Support/Stabilizers



Similar to shoulder mounted rigs, but smaller and less confining are hand-held support systems, which allow the camera to be more intimate and free in movements. Designed to combat jerkiness and smooth the images being shot, these are used in situations where fast and intimate shooting is desired. Glidecam offers a range of handheld stabilizers with the HD Series. Prices start at \$450 for the HD-1000, which supports compact cameras weighing 1.5 to 3.5 lbs. The HD-2000 for \$550 is ideal for DSLR setups weighing 2-6 lbs. From there, prices climb to \$650 for the HD-4000, which can support cameras up to 10 lbs.

Sled/Vest Systems



A sled is a system that holds the camera and isolates the operator's body from causing unwanted vibrations. The camera can be boomed up and down and also moved into various positions easily, since a negative buoyancy is maintained on the camera arm. An example of a sled is Steadicam's M-1i Sled, which is made for HD broadcast and feature film use. It is of a modular nature for adapting to the filmmaker's needs. A low vertical profile provides flexibility for the operator for positioning the monitor and gimbal as necessary, making a wide variety of monitors available for use. The iso-elastic arm can handle up to 70 lbs of lifting capacity, is adjustable and provides a smooth operation with a 29-inch boom range. The MSRP in in the mid two thousand to upper three thousand range, depending on the items being acquired.

Another example is the GLIDECAM X-30 Professional Camera Stabilization System (MSRP \$16,000), which utilizes bodymounted camera stabilization, isolating the camera operator's body motion from the camera (which remains balanced in a relatively motionless and isolated state). This makes it usable from within vehicles, when walking or running, using stairs or moving across uneven terrain. The support arm can be boomed up and down, pivoted in and out and from side to side. It can handle cameras from 15-30 lbs. The complete system consists of the support arm, a support vest and support sled.

- •1/2 pound raw mung beans
- 2 cups water
- •2 tablespoons olive oil
- •1 onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
 1/4 pound boneless pork loin, cut into 1-inch cubes
- •salt and ground black pepper to
- •1/4 pound peeled and deveined
- •1 small tomato, diced
- 3 cups chicken broth, or more as needed
- 1/2 pound fresh spinach leave

Directions:

Bring the mung beans and the water to a boil in a pot; cook at a boil until the beans are soft, about 40 minutes. Mash the beans; set aside.

Heat the olive oil in a large pot; cook and stir the onion and garlic in the hot oil over medium heat until softened, 5 to 7 minutes.

Add the pork; season with salt and pepper. Continue cooking the mixture another 3 minutes.

Gently stir the prawns into the mixture; cook 2 minutes more.

Add the tomatoes; cook another 3 minutes. Reduce heat, and pour the chicken broth over the mixture; allow the mixture to simmer in the broth for 5 minutes.

Add the mashed beans to the soup; mix well. Cook another 5 minutes, stirring frequently to prevent any of the mixture from sticking to the bottom of the pot.

Add more chicken broth or water if the soup is too thick. Stir the spinach leaves into the soup and cook 2 minutes more before serving hot.



Daing na bangus Fried marinated milkfish

- •2 pcs. Boneless Bangus (Milkfish), Butterflied with skin-on
- •2/3 cup vinegar
- 1 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. freshly ground black pepper 4 cloves crushed garlic.

Marinating Instructions:

Flatten Bangus with skin on top and place in baking pan (or any flat surface like baking pan)

Sprinkle the crushed garlic on all the Bangus surface

Now pour in vinegar, then season with pepper and salt.

Safely cover and narinate Bangus in the refrigerator overnight to get full flavor.

To Cook:

In a hot frying pan, add the 4 tbsps. of cooking oil and heat till it just starts to smoke over medium-high heat. Place the Bangus fillet, skinside down.

Lower heat to medium and cook uncovered about 4 minutes each side.

Brown the marinade garlic and place it on top of the bangus.

Serve Daing na Bangus with rice, and atchara.



Ingredients

- •3 to 4 lbs. green papaya, julienned
- •2 medium sized carrots, julienned
- •1 large onion, thinly sliced lengthwise
- •10 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
- •2 tbsp whole peppercorn
- 1 large red bell pepper, cut into strips
- •1 knob ginger, cut into thin strips
- 1/4 cup salt (to dehydrate papaya)
- •1½ tsp salt (for the brine or syrup)
- •2 cups white vinegar
- •1 1/2 cups granulated sugar
- 2 small boxes raisins

Instructions

Place the julienned papaya in a large bowl and combine ½ cup salt then mix until the salt is well distributed. Cover the bowl and place inside the refrigerator overnight (the salt will dehydrate the papaya).

Place the julienned papaya in a colander or strainer then rinse with running water.

Using cheesecloth (or any cloth) as a container, put the rinsed papaya inside the cloth and squeeze until all the liquid comes out.

Put the papaya back in the large bowl and combine with carrots, garlic, ginger, onions, whole peppercorn, bell pepper, and raisins

Heat the saucepan and pour-in the vinegar and bring to a boil.

Add the sugar and 1½ tsp salt then stir until well diluted

Turn off the heat and allow the syrup to cool down until temperature is low enough to handle.

Place the combined vegetables and spices in a sterilized airtight jar and pour-in the syrup

Seal the jar and place inside the refrigerator for a week (or 5 days minimum to achieve the expected texture and flavor).

Serve cold with fried dishes.

Migrant Worker voices must be central to review of Foreign Worker Program

Open work permits, family reunification and permanent immigration status on landing for Seasonal Agricultural Workers, Caregivers and Temporary Foreign Workers remain priorities.

Canada, February 18, 2016 -The Coalition for Migrant Worker Rights Canada (CMWRC), the representative alliance migrant worker groups across the country, is responding to Minister Mihychuk's statements in the mainstream media about forthcoming review of the Temporary Foreign Workers Program by calling for further details, including timelines, migrant worker involvement and scope of the review. Migrant worker advocates have been calling for Mobility, Voice and Equality for Migrant Workers, including open work permits; an end to discriminatory Labour Market Impact Assessment (LMIA) regulations like the 4 in and 4 out rule; and permanent immigration status on landing.

"As a country, we need to honour and celebrate low-waged, and racialized migrant workers for feeding our families; taking care of children, the sick and the elderly; and doing backbreaking work to build our economy," says Syed Hussan of the CMWRC. "Migrant worker voices must be central to the review to show Canadians the critical importance of migrant workers, and the need to ensure that they have full rights, and permanent immigration status just like everyone else who works here."



"I am morally and ethically opposed to any action that ends another human being's life, and that denies a person the natural life cycle from conception to natural death," said Senator Enverga in a statement following the tabling of the report in both houses of Parliament. "Bishop Samuel J. Aquila once said: '... we must have the 613-996-8895 courage to proclaim the culture of life lars.andersen@sen.parl.gc.ca for the common good of society. This is a duty and responsibility ...'. I am taking this duty seriously in my work as

professional, a senator and will do my part to ensure that we protect those most vulnerable in our society from severe risk of harm," the Senator continued.

> The report is the latest step in the process to comply with the Supreme Court of Canada's judgement in Carter v. Canada (Attorney General), which has given Parliament until June 6, 2016 to provide a legislative framework under which persons can obtain assistance in ending their lives before natural death occurs.

> "I am reading the report with grave concern, noting a clear lack of safeguards and protection of the vulnerable that are found in other jurisdictions' relevant legislation on physician-assisted suicide euthanasia. This report opens the door for minors, persons below the age of 18, to access assisted dying three years down the road; it recommends that persons with psychiatric condition should not be excluded from receiving medical assistance in dying; and it recommends forcing physicians who oppose the practice based on their conscience to refer patients to other willing physicians, rather than providing information to the patient and reporting the patient's wishes to a government agency. There is still much study needed, and I will ensure that the voice of those who are concerned about this report is heard in the Senate of Canada when we debate the report and the forthcoming legislative proposals from the government," Senator Enverga concluded.
